

SCRC Grants \$4M to NC Projects

The Southeast Crescent Regional Commission (SCRC) has announced ten recipients from the inaugural State Economic and Infrastructure Development (SEID) grant program. This flagship grant program aims to revitalize and spur economic development across counties in Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Virginia.

In North Carolina, **ten projects have been selected to receive funding totaling \$4 million**. Of the projects awarded, 92% are located in distressed communities and 80% are infrastructure projects.

In the Kerr-Tar Region, the following projects received funding:

Frontier Warren: Developing Frontier Warren's Entrepreneurial Ecosystem - Town of Warrenton

Frontier Warren will receive **\$80,000** to expand its business incubator and entrepreneurial ecosystem in Warren County. This project, in partnership with Research Triangle Park (RTP) and the Town of Warrenton, aims to increase capacity and resources for local small businesses. It will offer specialized entrepreneurial education, networking opportunities, and mentorship to empower entrepreneurs and stimulate economic vitality in rural North Carolina.



Low-Pressure Pump Station - Henderson, NC The City of Henderson will receive \$500,000 for the installation of a low-pressure pump station. This project aims to alleviate environmental health impacts, enhance residents' quality of life, and address housing stock shortages in the community by replacing problematic septic systems in the Main St. area.



Kerr-Tar Regional Council of Governments, the local development district funded by SCRC, assisted the City of Henderson and the Town of Warrenton with grant writing and submittal.

On Tuesday, July 23rd, our regional program manager, Amanda Lewis, led a crucial discussion on Digital Inclusion Planning at the Kerr-Tar Regional Council of Governments office. The meeting brought together Vance County stakeholders to underscore the vital importance of digital inclusion in our community. Participants had the opportunity to voice their perspectives and contribute to the refinement of the newly updated plan.



This meeting was in collaboration with Kylie Foley from BAND-NC who discussed the importance of equipping counties and regions with the tools to build more digitally equitable communities. Digital inclusion includes but isn't limited to providing opportunities for employment, tele health, and economic development.

Your input is crucial for updating the plan and using it to pursue grant funding for Vance County and the Kerr-Tar region. Please provide your feedback on the plan by August 15th to be considered in the plan refresh. Your participation is vital for securing funding opportunities such as:

- National Digital Inclusion Alliance, "Trailblazer Grant": Announcement in early September.
- National Technology Information Alliance "Competitive Grant": Announcement by July 30th, 2024.
- NC State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program: Announcement in August 2024.
- USDA: Broadband Technical Assistance (BTA) Grant: Proposals due August 20th, 2024.


