Granville Co. Receives Funding from Duke Energy Foundation



Granville County was recently awarded a total of \$30,000 from the Duke Energy Foundation's Emergency Preparedness fund. \$25,000 was awarded to the Emergency Management Department to purchase Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) and to purchase supplies used to operate emergency shelters. IEI Receives \$1.2M Digital Equity Grant for Broadband Expansion & Digital Inclusion Efforts



The N.C. Apply Now: Carbon Reduction Program

NCDOT's Transportation Planning Division (TPD) is administering the Carbon Reduction Program funds for the rural areas of the state.

What is the purpose of the Carbon Reduction Program?

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) established a new funding opportunity for projects to reduce carbon dioxide emissions from on-road highway sources. The RPO can submit up to 12 projects to NCDOT for scoring and selection. Municipalities, county governments, tribal governments, and public transit agencies are eligible to apply. The minimum project cost is \$100,000 and a 20% local match is required in most cases (there are some exceptions). Examples of eligible projects include but are not limited to:

- Construction of new sidewalks
- Transit expansion
- New transit operations
- Park & ride lots
- Transit electrification
- Alternative fuel conversions
- Electric vehicle charging
- Traffic flow improvements
- Idle reduction

Economic Impact of Local Airports

Last month, the Division of Aviation released a State of Aviation Report and highlighted the impact of our region's three airports on the North Carolina Economy.

-Henderson-Oxford (HNZ) Airport (Oxford):

<u>\$15,000,000</u> economic output, 60 jobs.

-Raleigh Regional at Person County Airport

(**Roxboro**): \$53,070,000 economic output, 245 jobs.

-Triangle North Executive (LHZ) Airport

(**Louisburg**): \$28,030,000 economic output, 220

jobs.



Shakonna, a Person County resident, completed the Central Sterile Processing Prep Course which is offered through occupational skills training at Piedmont Community College last month. "I wanted to take the Central Sterile Processing Prep Course so that I could have a better job to help support myself and my child," says Shakonna when asked about selecting the short-term training at PCC. While in training, Shakonna completed a required internship at Person Memorial Hospital in Roxboro where she was able to actively transfer learned skills from



her classwork into the "real world" practice. Now, she is currently seeking a position at Duke University Hospital or UNC Health as a Sterile Processor or Medical Specialist. Shakonna states that she would recommend the NextGen Program to others because "it's a good program to be in!"
